

One of my favourite poems by Mary Oliver is "Song for Autumn".

This year, more than in previous years, I find myself resonating more with the poem's focus on the beauty and magic of this time of the year, the letting go, and trusting what is to come. Perhaps this is due to the unusual and oft auoted "unprecedented" times in which we live. In the midst of the falling leaves and shortening of days, we can be reassured that God is present. # St Charles Borromeo The Un-ordained Archbishop 4th November



Charles Borromeo was born in Italy and lived in Milan from 1538 to 1584. He was canonized in 1610. Charles was one of the most important figures of the counter-reformation in Italy.

He is the Patron Saint of bishops, cardinals, seminarians and spiritual leaders. His uncle, Pope Pius IV, made him Archbishop of Milan three years before Charles became a priest.

Charles, however, was one of the ablest and most compassionate Christian leaders of his age. He established theological colleges to train future clergy, encouraged children to be taught the Christian faith, and increased the help given to the poor.

Our ten bells rang out for our Sunday morning service for the first time on 10th September and, even if I say so myself, they sound magnificent. I cannot say "thank you" too often to all my fellow ringers, the clergy, our congregation, friends, neighbours and various grant-giving charitable organisations who have supported this project in any way, from its launch in February 2021 through to its successful completion. It is a wonderful achievement and such a fitting way to mark the church's 150th anniversary.

The training and bell sensor equipment has been upgraded, and the installation of a new CCTV system will not only support teaching of learners in the ringing room but also allow people downstairs in church to see live pictures of the bells as they ring.

Practices and teaching sessions have recommenced and we have exciting plans to make our tower a ringing teaching hub for the benefit of ringers from the whole of the Fylde and beyond. If you had ever thought that you would like to have a go at ringing a bell, then now is the perfect opportunity to do so. Please contact me for further information.

# Poppy Cascade Update



By the time you are reading this, hopefully, the poppy cascade will be on display.

Following a holiday in North Yorkshire last October, where I witnessed the amazing poppy displays in Ripon and Thirsk, I wondered if the bellringers could do something like that at St Annes and have a cascade of poppies from the bell tower.

From this the idea was born. I spoke to Fr Glen who thought it was a wonderful idea and gave it his full support. However it was with some trepidation that I launched the project in early 2023. I thought we would need a few thousand hand knitted/crocheted/sewn poppies to make it work. What would I do if we only received a few hundred? I launched the project on social media and was amazed at the positive response. I really need not have worried. The local community offered amazing support to the project. Many local groups such as St Annes WI craft group, Bonney

Fabrics & Wool, Ansdell & Fairhaven WI, Knit & Natter, Bizzie Fingers, Preston Embroidery and Textile group, Seaside Stitchers, Fylde Coast Crafters, A Good Yarn Knitting Group, Busy Bees, Rock Choir (and probably some I have forgotten, sorry!) came together to produce huge numbers of poppies. In addition numerous individuals have contributed poppies and all donations however large or small were gratefully received. As well as many donations from residents in St Annes, we have received donations from people in Kirkham, Blackpool, Preston, Garstang and from further afield including Bristol, Yorkshire, London, Norway and even the USA. There are too many individuals to name them all (and many were anonymous donations) but I must mention two ladies who made a tremendous commitment to the project. Marcia contributed 1,300 poppies, and Margaret contributed over 1,200 poppies as well as helping at every assembly session. Thank you ladies, you are amazing!

In the next issue we will share photos of the finished cascade in place, but for now here are some photos from assembly session 3. Thank you to everyone who has contributed to the project in any way.

We must thank Mrs Hodgson, for allowing us to bring the poppy net to Heyhouses school. Thank you to all the children in Year 6 & Year 4 and to the school staff who all worked together to help us finish the net!

We have no poppies left to attach! We were able to lay the cascade out fully in the school hall and to see the whole thing for the first time. I hope you agree that it looks amazing. Cannot wait to see what it looks like hanging from the bell tower. Thank you to everyone who has helped with this project in any way.

# News from Sunday School

We are fortunate that this did not put people off and so thanks to the support of the volunteers our Sunday School is now 'up and running'. We are very grateful to the church's Safeguarding Officer, Chris Hale, who has ensured that all paperwork has been completed correctly and that all the legal and diocesan guidelines have been followed.

A huge thank you must go to all the volunteers, Anna, Edwina, Heather, Karen H, Lia, Rhona and Sarah and to Fr Glen and Fr Ryan for their advice and support. Anna leads the crafting side of the sessions and has some wonderful ideas for crafts. She has brought together several members of the congregation, 'Crafty Ladies', who are supporting her in a variety of ways. It is really good to see everyone working together to support this mission within our parish.

We meet on the  $2^{nd}$  &  $4^{th}$  Sundays of the month in the Parish Rooms at 10:15 am for approximately 45 minutes. We come across to church during the time of Offertory so that we can all be part of the service.

We are currently only working with children aged 3-5, until it is more established and we have additional volunteers.

We are also open to any further offers of help. Currently all volunteers are attending the sessions, but after Christmas a rota will be in place to allow the leaders and volunteers to worship or carry out their other duties in church, whether that is on the coffee rota or working as a sidesperson - the more volunteers, the better. Please don't be put off by the paperwork involved, it really is a very straightforward process.

### Mothers' Union from Christine Buckley

Here we are in mid October and still enjoying our gardens between the heavy showers. We are still picking our own fruits and the last of the green beans. It reminds us so much about harvest time with all its blessings.

The church's celebration of harvest was quite different this year as the very gratefully received gifts from the schools and congregation were distributed to food banks rather than distributed to individuals. I am sure they have been forwarded to families who will appreciate the food and the toiletries.

At our meeting in September, Fr Ian Hollin gave us a splendid and most fascinating talk about his childhood and teens, and how it connected with the title "Acid Drops and Broken Biscuits".

Gerald Wilson, who many of you know as Head Server in church, and who has organised our parish pilgrimages to Walsingham, kindly came to speak to our members at our meeting in October. It was entitled "The Wonder of Walsingham". He gave us a wonderful history of its origin, explaining when the shrine was established by an English noblewoman, Richeldis de Faverches, in 1061 after having had an apparition of Mary, the mother of Jesus. Today there is a holy well whose waters have healing properties; the water can be used there, or taken away in containers to help other people. The original Basilica of our Lady of Walsingham was Roman Catholic; sadly it was destroyed in the Reformation but they still have a shrine. The Anglican shrine was built in 1938 and extended in the 1960's. Gerald showed us some wonderful slides of the inside of the shrine and the holy areas and chapels. He also showed us some photographs of pilgrims from our own church, including members of our Mothers' Union who have visited Walsingham over the last few years. He very much hopes that more people will join the pilgrimage next year.

Before Gerald spoke we prayed for the other dioceses who join the Blackburn Diocese for our annual Wave of Prayer. These include Bhopal, Guinea, High Veld, Nambale and Niger Delta. Members all over the world are praying for peace in all areas in this terrible time of conflict.

November is, of course, a time when we particularly remember our departed loved ones and there will be opportunities to do this in church, but also at home for those housebound or unwell.

At our next meeting on 14th November at 1.45 pm in the Parish Rooms we will be creating some seasonal corsages with the expertise of our own member, Sheila Dodd, which should be fun.

As we look forward to Advent and Christmas we must remain positive and enjoy our lives, and, with love and prayers, keep well and happy.



## The Messiah - Funds for Ukraine & Local

After the great success of this year's Crucifixion concert, we wanted to raise our efforts to new heights and so we organised a 'Come and Sing' performance of Handel's great oratorio, The Messiah.

In the talented and hard-working hands of both Alistair MacKenzie, our Musical Director, and Dr Kevin Morgan at the organ, this special and inspiring concert took shape, as singers from across the region were invited to come and sing in the choir and as soloists.

All were welcomed. The singers ranged from those who had never sung this work before to those who had much experience in performing Handel's Messiah. The combined efforts pulled together to culminate in a triumphant and moving concert, performed by amateurs and directed by professionals. The entire evening was for the glory of God and the relief of those who are in need, both in this town and far away in Ukraine where a war still rages against innocent families.

In the weeks leading up to the performance, there was excitement and anticipation as the prospect of tackling Handel's Messiah came ever closer. This composition has been performed in public continuously for the past 300 years, and has never gone out of favour. It is among the world's most performed works.

Handel's Messiah is many layered, so each performance reveals something entirely unique. Musically diverse, it offers both performers and listeners something to love. It is a dramatic oratorio, like a religious opera, but without costumes. It is profoundly religious and yet is accessible to everyone. Handel composed this work, not for a church setting but for the concert stage.

Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2023 finally arrived, and the rehearsal for choir, soloists and musicians started at 1.30 pm. The programme included a selection of choruses, arias and recitatives from all three parts of this sacred Oratorio. Our practice lasted until 5pm when a tea break gave everyone a chance to recover before the evening performance.

The performance was supported by our congregation, as well as friends and Messiah fans. The atmosphere was wonderfully inclusive and had a great sense of the community coming together, as Handel intended it should.

We are very privileged and fortunate as a church to be able to host such an inclusive community event, which not only delivered a musically wonderful event of some weight but also raised a significant amount of money to help others in our world. Our ability to do this is down mainly to one person who organised, inspired, and ran the whole event. Alistair McKenzie, we are very fortunate to have you as our Director of Music. We are also grateful to Dr Kevin Morgan who accompanied the singing on the organ; thank you for all your skill and hard work. Thanks also go to all who came from far and near to perform and listen, especially the brave volunteers who sang solos, well done!

Special thanks go to Lisa MacKenzie and her helpers who provided tea and cakes

for the choir, to the church social committee who helped with the performance arrangements and refreshments in the interval, and to other church members who helped on the day.

# **New Poppy for Remembrance Sunday**

For the first time in 28 years, there is a new kind of poppy for Remembrance Sunday this year. It is plastic free!

Director of the Poppy Appeal, Andy Taylor-Whyte explains: "We are very proud to introduce the plastic-free poppy. It will not only enable people to support our Armed Forces community, but it also continues the RBL's commitment to sustainability."

The new poppy has been three years in its development and making. The aim was to reduce the use of single-use plastic and to "be economical, sustainable, and have less impact on the environment."

The new poppy design has a 40% smaller carbon footprint, and is made from "bespoke red and green paper." The paper comes from a

blend of renewable fibres, 50 per cent of which has been recovered from the waste used in the production of coffee cups.

The plastic-free poppy will be available alongside remaining stocks of the current poppy, to reduce any waste of poppies already produced.

Poppies containing single-use plastic can be returned to Sainsbury's stores for recycling.

## **New Christmas Carol**



This Christmas, the Church of England is inviting choirs across churches, schools, and communities to 'join the song' alongside one of the country's leading choral composers.

The 'song' is a new interpretation of 'The First Nowell.' It has been given a brand-new melody by the well-known composer Bob Chilcott and is the centrepiece of this year's Church of England Christmas focus: *Follow The Star: Join The Song.* The C of E theme for 2023 highlights how singing can help draw people closer to God and one another, through the journey from Advent to Epiphany.

Bob Chilcott's most often performed pieces include *Can you hear me?*, *A Little Jazz Mass*, and the *St John Passion*. His music has been recorded by The King's Singers, King's College, Cambridge, The Sixteen, Tenebrae and The BBC Singers, among other choirs and groups.

"It's been an absolute thrill for me to be able to write new music for the well-known carol, 'The First Nowell,' and to be a part of the 'Follow the Star' campaign at Christmas 2023," Bob Chilcott said.

"I have aimed to make this melody easy to pick up and I hope all will enjoy singing it, at a time of year when the joy of singing is so central to worship and to the celebration of Christmas." The carol is published by Oxford University Press and features as part of OUP's new edition of the favourite series, Carols for Choirs 6. The C of E is offering a wide variety of free resources available for churches, schools, and choirs.
