

From the Vicarage ... Resurrection

As the Church prepares for Easter and the joy of resurrection, we would do well to remember what we are actually about as his disciples today.

As, 2,000 years ago, his fearful disciples went from the upper room after the horror of Good Friday to visit Christ's tomb in the burial garden, having deserted him in his hour of need, it would have been a pathetic sight indeed.

In their emptiness they expected to find a shrine to the dead, and no doubt would have felt deeply remorseful for the way they had let Jesus down.

At first, a deeply sad scene seems to become even worse with the huge stone rolled away and the suspicion that grave robbers have stolen their friend's corpse. Then, their sadness is transformed into joy by the living Christ making himself known to Mary, and then later to the other disciples.

If Jesus didn't rise from the dead, and if Mary, Thomas, Peter, Andrew and all the others merely imagined seeing him and then went out to tell the known world a fairy story, then I would gladly offer up our church and the churchyard as a monument

to the past and as a nice spot for walking the dog.

However, the reason there have been churches across the world through three millennia, is, of course, because it is no dead shrine.

Rather, it is the place where generation after generation have encountered Jesus Christ.

His resurrection can be ours too. We can be transformed from that which was empty and lifeless to that which is filled with the power of Easter. Jesus really can change lives and when a group of his followers are serious about their faith and about making a difference for him in their communities, amazing things can happen.

My hope is that those who enjoy our churchyard will also take the opportunity to come into the church and see another visible testimony of a community of faith that is actively reaching out in service to all.

Alleluia, Christ is Risen!

Palm Sunday and Holy Week

The events of Easter took place over a week, traditionally called Passion Week.

It began on Palm Sunday. After all His teaching and healing, Jesus had built a following.

On the Sunday before He was to die, Jesus and His followers arrived at Jerusalem. The city was crowded. Jewish people were arriving to celebrate Passover. This commemorates how they had escaped from slavery in Egypt nearly 1,500 years earlier.

Jesus rode into the city on a young donkey. He was greeted like a conquering hero. Cheering crowds waved palm branches in tribute. He was hailed as the Messiah who had come to re-establish a Jewish kingdom.

The next day Jesus and his followers returned to Jerusalem. Jesus went to the temple, the epicentre of the Jewish faith, and confronted the money-changers and merchants who were ripping off the people. He overturned their tables and accused them of being thieves. The religious authorities were alarmed and feared how He was stirring up the crowds.

On the Tuesday, they challenged Jesus, questioning His authority. He answered by challenging and condemning their hypocrisy. Later that day Jesus spoke to His disciples about future times. He warned them about fake religious leaders; the coming destruction of Jerusalem; wars, earthquakes and famines; and how His followers would face persecution.

By midweek the Jewish religious leaders and elders were so angry with Jesus that they began plotting to arrest and kill Him. One of Jesus' disciples, Judas, went to the chief priests and agreed to betray Him to them.

Jesus and the twelve disciples gathered on the Thursday evening to celebrate the Passover meal. This is known as the Last Supper. During the evening, Jesus initiated a ritual still marked by Christians – Holy Communion – which commemorates His death. Jesus broke bread and shared it and a cup of wine with His disciples.

Judas then left to meet the other plotters. Jesus continued to teach the others and then went outside into an olive grove to pray. He even prayed for all future believers. He agonised over what was to come but chose the way of obedience. Luke's Gospel records Him praying, 'Father if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will but yours be done'. Minutes later Judas arrived with soldiers and the chief priests and Jesus was arrested.

Easter Eve or Holy Saturday

Easter Eve is the last day of Lent. It is the day between Good Friday and Easter Day, and represents the one full day that Jesus was dead. It is a day of quiet reflection and anticipation for Christians worldwide.

In various church traditions it is known as Easter Eve, Holy Saturday, the Great Sabbath, Hallelujah Saturday, Saturday of the Glory, and Black Saturday.

Easter Eve is sometimes incorrectly called Easter Saturday, but Easter Saturday is the Saturday *following* Easter Sunday.

Most churches do not have any services on Easter Eve. In the Catholic Church, the altar remains stripped completely bare. Many Lutheran, Anglican, Methodist, and other churches observe many of the same customs as the Catholic Church; however, their altars may be covered in black instead of being stripped.

In the Catholic, Lutheran, Anglican, and Methodist traditions, Easter Eve lasts until nightfall, after which the Easter Vigil is celebrated, marking the official start of the Easter season.

What did Jesus do on that one full day in the grave? Christian understanding varies on this.

The Roman Catholic, Eastern Orthodox and most mainline Protestant churches teach that Jesus descended to the realm of the dead on Holy Saturday, to save the righteous souls who died before His crucifixion.

The catechism of the Catholic church calls the descent "the last phase of Jesus' messianic mission," during which He "opened heaven's gates for the just who had gone before Him."

Often called "the Harrowing of Hell," the dramatic image of Jesus breaking down the doors of Hades has proved almost irresistible to artists, from the painter Hieronymus Bosch to the poet Dante to countless Eastern Orthodox iconographers.

However, some Protestants say there is little scriptural evidence for the detour to hell, and that even Jesus' own words contradict it. For on Good Friday, Jesus told the Good Thief crucified alongside Him that "today you will be with Me in Paradise," according to Luke's Gospel."

"That's the only clue we have as to what Jesus was doing between death and resurrection," John Piper, a prominent evangelical author and pastor from Minnesota, has said. "I don't think the thief went to hell and that hell is called paradise."

The Bible says little about the interlude between Jesus' death and resurrection. Churches that teach He descended to the realm of the dead usually quote 1 Peter 3:18-20. "Christ was put to death as a human, but made alive by the Spirit," Peter writes. "And it was by the Spirit that He went to preach to the spirits in prison."

The descent might not have become a doctrine if not for a fourth-century bishop named Rufinus, who added that Jesus went *ad inferna* – to hell – in his commentary on the Apostles' Creed. The phrase stuck, but it was officially added to the influential creed only centuries later.




The 'Fruitful'App

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Our mission is to help you grow as disciples through knowing scripture better and praying with greater confidence.

There are Daily Devotions & Prayers, Bishop Philip's Lent Course is currently available along with the daily Lent Devotions.

One of the most exciting parts of the app is the podcasts for children. 'Follow the Son' is for children aged aged 3-7.

This has a morning & evening episode with a story and prayer.

For the older children aged 6-11 called 'Bible Podlets'.

Additional resources are available to download along with a free activity e-book.

It is really worth exploring for both adults and children. 'Follow the Son' has been trialled by a member of the Sunday School team and she said it was very user-friendly and the evening one very calming.

Other adults have accessed the Lent Devotions online and again found them very useful.
