

# From the Vicarage ..... Salvation from on High

During this month we will celebrate two great festivals of the church year, Ascension Day (or more correctly, The Feast of The Ascension of Jesus Christ), and Pentecost (or Whitsun as it used to be known). Marking the fortieth and fiftieth days of Easter respectively, they are both solemnities, the highest rank of all of the feasts in the church year. They are so highly ranked because of their importance for us as Christians.

The first, Ascension Day, always Thursday, celebrated on а into the ascension commemorates of Our Lord after His heaven The Bible records at resurrection least eight appearances of Jesus to a number of people, and at different times and places, before He ascended into heaven. His first appearance was to Mary Magdalene at the tomb, and He appeared for a final time to five hundred of His followers when He the completion declared of mission, and the promise of the Holy Spirit.

I am sure that the disciples, His closest friends, were still struggling with the fact that the man whose death they had witnessed, the man who had miraculously returned from the dead, was now telling them that He must now leave to be with His Father. I don't know about you, but that must have been distressing and

confusing in equal measure. One small comfort would have been our Lord's promise that He would send the Holy Spirit. As the Book of Acts tells us, this would arrive when one hundred and twenty of His followers (which included His mother), were gathered in Jerusalem for the Jewish Feast of Shavuot. The arrival of the Holy Spirit was also foretold by Jesus on the night prior to His arrest when He promised that He would send the Holy Spirit (The Paraclete) to be with them for ever.

This promise was fulfilled less than two months later at the feast known to us as Pentecost. The Holy Spirit also gave the apostles the gifts necessary to preach the gospel. Jesus had given them instructions to "go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you". At the first Pentecost, Peter, inspired by the Holy Spirit, preached his first homily, explaining how the prophet Joel had foretold the coming of the Holy Spirit. After this sermon, Peter converted three thousand people. For this reason. Pentecost is considered the birthday of the church.

# Pentecost - 19th May 2024

# Here are three articles relating to Pentecost on which you may like to read and reflect.

#### Pentecost - not a Ghost but a Gift

We used to call it Whitsun – 'White Sunday' - because long ago children marched to church in white on that day. There are no processions nowadays, and we've even changed its name. It's now known as 'Pentecost', which is more accurate but needs explaining.

Pentecost marks a vital event in Christian history. It is celebrated 50 days after Easter. The year Jesus was crucified (which took place at the Passover), the remnant of His followers, just 120 of them, were together in an upper room in Jerusalem. They were afraid to show their faces in case the authorities arrested them, but on the day of Passover, they had an amazing collective experience.

They described it in terms of wind and fire, a great surge of spiritual energy and confidence. Afraid no longer, they burst out onto the streets where crowds were gathering for the festival. Led by Peter, they began to tell them about Jesus and His resurrection. As they did so, although many of the people in the crowd were foreigners who spoke other languages, everyone heard them in their own tongue. Peter told them that what they were seeing, was the fulfilment of an old prophecy when God would pour out His Spirit on the whole human race, men and women, young and old.

As a result of His words and the extraordinary spectacle, 3,000 people believed and were baptised in the name of Jesus. They were the nucleus of what in 100 years would be a Church that would turn history upside down. For Christians Pentecost is in effect the birthday of the Church.

Many people find the whole idea of the Holy Spirit mysterious and elusive. It wasn't helped by the earlier title 'Holy Ghost'. The spirit is not spiritually a 'ghost' but a precious gift.

#### **Fire of Pentecost**

"You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you and you will be witnesses to me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth" Acts 1:8

We all get tired and battle weary sometimes. The disciples of Jesus had just been through a three-year long roller coaster adventure with Jesus that had culminated in His death, resurrection and ascension into heaven.

The range of emotions would have been hugely taxing in the days leading up to Pentecost, as they remembered Jesus weeping in the garden of Gethsemane, betrayed by Judas, brutally beaten and crucified, and then dead and buried. Then there had been the shock and awe of finding out that He was alive again! Then Jesus left them again, to return to His

Father. By the time the day of Pentecost arrived, the disciples would indeed have welcomed some fresh spiritual fire!

For us today, many of us have felt emotionally drained with the uncertainties caused by Covid 19, the worry of prices rising at an alarming rate, and now the pain and uncertainty of what will happen in the war in Ukraine and Israel.

So, what better day to pray for fresh spiritual fire for each of us? As we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and birth of the Church, let us thank God that He will never leave us or forsake us.

#### **Day of Pentecost: Whit Sunday**

Pentecost took place on the well-established Jewish festival of Firstfruits, which was observed at the beginning of the wheat harvest. It was seven weeks after Easter, or 50 days including Easter.

A feast day to celebrate the country's wheat harvest does not sound exactly world-changing, but that year, it became one of the most important days in world history. For Pentecost was the day that Jesus sent the Holy Spirit - the day the Church was born.

Jesus had told His disciples that something big was going to happen, and that they were to wait for it in Jerusalem, instead of returning to Galilee. Jesus had plans for His disciples, but He knew they could not do the work themselves. They would need His help.

The disciples waited in Jerusalem, praying together with His other followers, for many days. Then on that fateful morning there was suddenly the sound as of a mighty rushing wind. Tongues of flame flickered on their heads, and they began to praise God in many tongues, to the astonishment of those who heard them. The curse of Babel (Genesis 11: 1-9) was dramatically reversed that morning.

That morning the Holy Spirit came to dwell in the disciples and followers of Jesus. The Church was born. The Christians were suddenly full of life and power, utterly different from their former fearful selves. The change in them was permanent.

Peter gave the first ever sermon of the Christian Church that morning, proclaiming Jesus was the Messiah. His boldness in the face of possible death was in marked contrast to the man who had denied Jesus 50 days before. Three thousand people responded, were converted, and were baptised. How is that for fast church growth!

Of course, Pentecost was not the first time the Holy Spirit had acted in this world. All

through the Old Testament there are accounts of how God's Spirit guided people and strengthened them. So now, because of Christ's death and resurrection, He could dwell in (indwell) them. From now on, every Christian could have the confidence that Jesus was with them constantly, through the indwelling of His Holy Spirit.

# Easter in St Annes Square

We have a special way of marking Easter at St Annes Parish Church. It begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Maundy Thursday, continues with Stations of the Cross and the Solemn Liturgy of the Passion on Good Friday and the Paschal Vigil on Holy Saturday, and ends with the Parish Mass on Easter Day.

Someone remarked to me the other day that there was little, if anything, on television about Easter, so how would people know why we have such a significant holiday or Holy Day? As well as sharing this time with other Christians, I would say that to be able to bear witness to the events of Easter in St Annes Square is a valuable way of ensuring that as many people as, possible hear about the life of Jesus.

This year the service, held on Good Friday, was organised by St Annes Christian Service Church, with people from other churches reading from scripture and offering a short explanation of the passages. The hymns and songs varied from 'When I Survey the Wondrous Cross' to 'Here is Love Vast as the Ocean'.

The sun shone on all who shopped or worshipped and there was an excellent crowd of people who gathered there to witness this very special day in the lives of Christians.

Please do join us if you can.


# Art Exhibition





# Mary, the Blessed Virgin Visits Elizabeth

Mary, the virgin mother of Jesus, has, for many centuries, been considered pre-eminent among all the saints, by the eastern and western churches.

In the gospels, Mary makes her first appearance as a teenager. Nothing is known of her childhood, and what we do know of her is found mostly in Matthew 1-2 and in Luke 1-2. If you read both accounts, you will notice that Luke's account seems to give the story from Mary's standpoint, whereas Matthew concentrates more on Joseph's side of things. In both accounts the virginal conception of Christ is clearly stated. Mary's quiet devotion to God and her total acceptance of His will, shine forth.

Her visit to Elizabeth, when both were pregnant, is a moving and poignant account of two humble, ordinary women, suddenly caught up in a great event that would shape world history. Their trusting faith in God and acceptance of His will, shines through.

After Jesus was born, Mary faded into the background, and makes only a few appearances:

- When the family visits Jerusalem and she loses her son on the way home;
- When she urges Him to help the wedding party in Cana with its wine problem;
- When Jesus gives her into the keeping of the beloved disciple when He is dying on the cross.
- Mary's last appearance is in Acts chapter one, just before Pentecost.

Mary obviously joined the early Church, but her role was never one of teaching and preaching, and indeed she remained so much in the background that nothing more about her is known for certain. Both Ephesus and Jerusalem have claimed to be the place of her death.

Mary, who was chosen to be the mother of Jesus Christ, He who is both God and Man, holds a unique place in the history of mankind. Down the centuries that have followed, the Church has paid special honour to Mary – and well deserved it is. "All generations shall call me blessed..."


