

FROM THE VICARAGE

Dear Friends,

It's often said that the easiest way to stir a Church of England congregation is to use incense—or mention the Virgin Mary! I'd also add the choice of hymns to that list. Each of us has our favourites, and some would be perfectly content to sing the same ones every Sunday. But tensions can arise when the organist—or indeed the incumbent—selects an unfamiliar hymn or, worse still, a lesser-known tune. I've had more than a few post-service conversations where such choices were met with raised eyebrows and heartfelt opinions.

Hymns have been central to Christian worship since the earliest days of the Church. The disciples are said to have sung a hymn as they walked to the Mount of Olives before Jesus's crucifixion (Matthew 26:30). In Acts 16:25, Luke describes Paul and Silas praying and singing hymns in prison. St. Paul himself frequently encourages the singing of psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs (Ephesians 5:19; Colossians 3:16). These early hymns were likely drawn from the Jewish psalms—texts rich in devotion and praise—which were naturally adopted by the first Christians.

As the Church grew, so did its musical tradition. St. Ephrem the Syrian, who died in 373, wrote many hymns that shaped early Christian worship. Some, like *Strengthen for Service*, still appear in modern hymnals. These hymns were probably chanted in unison or by soloists, quite different from our congregational singing today. Yet even then, the power of combining sacred words with music was deeply understood.

The Reformation brought a seismic shift. As people began reading the Bible in English, metrical psalms emerged—no longer chanted in Latin plainsong, but sung in the vernacular. One of the most enduring examples is *The Lord's My Shepherd, I'll Not Want* from the Scottish Psalter of 1650. These psalms paved the way for the hymns we sing today.

Setting words to music makes them more memorable and emotionally resonant. A well-crafted tune can lift the spirit, stir the heart, and embed sacred truths deep within us. Charles Wesley grasped this beautifully, writing hundreds of hymns that continue to inspire and comfort generations of worshippers.

So next time you encounter a hymn that's unfamiliar, perhaps pause before passing judgment. It might just be the one that speaks to someone else's soul—or even yours.

Lancashire Traditional Recipes



A look at some of the favorite Lancashire recipes to enjoy at home. Its not all pies!

Lancashire Lash: a warming and economical dish made with mince and potatoes. Not the Scots version! Comfort food.

Ingredients:

Olive oil or lard for frying

A large white onion

500g beef or steak mince

2-3 carrots chopped

Beef stock/cube

4-5 old potatoes

Method—fry off onions gently, add mince and brown. Add carrots

Add beef stock, season to taste (try a dot of Lancashire Sauce from Booth's)

Simmer for 45 minutes or in the slow cooker overnight.

Add half the sliced potatoes and cook until tender

Cover the stew with sliced potatoes then bake until browned on top, just like a hotpot.

Serve with red cabbage, pickled or with apple. For variation add thyme.

If too thin thicken with corn flour or tomato puree.

CANADA MON AMOUR

Having travelled to many countries for holidays I had never particularly thought of Canada as a holiday destination. Nevertheless having ben invited by friends I decided to give it a try. I researched flights to find that Air Canada had started flying from Edinburgh to Montreal at a good rate so booked in for a 7 hour flight that only took 6! Headwinds. Food and service on the aircraft in English and in French was excellent. I was met by a friend and travelled by train to Ottawa where I was kindly accommodated.

Impressions—Canada is huge, everything is so clean, everybody goes out of their way to make you feel welcome. Empty roads, no potholes, the Canadian flag is everywhere, on every building, every house, perhaps to resist their larger southern neighbour...

The churches are interesting. Three main denominations—United Church of Canada, Roman Catholic and Anglican. I attended services at all three.



The united is a tiny church with a small congregation. The service was simple but joyful with individuals choosing songs (hymns) and a sermon involving tennis balls. It was led by a female pastor.

I then attended the Anglican Cathedral of Christ Church. A fairly simple service and I took communion as usual. Unusual was the instruction to hold out the left hand for a gluten free wafer iif needed!

HOUSEHOLD TIPS

Here are some proven tips to help you out around the house.

Seagull Strike

A particular menace around here is seagull strike, hitting car and windows with a smelly splatter. If not removed quickly they can stain paintwork.

The remedy — a teabag. Keep your old damp teabags handy. A quick rub and the splat is gone. Carry a bag in the car.

Teacups

The tannic acid in tea can leave cups stained. Not everyone uses a dishwasher. A quick remedy is to use denture cleaning tablets. Pop in a tablet top with hot water and leave 10 minutes and its sparkling clean. Use also for air fryers and slow cookers.

Silver cutlery.

Silver tarnish can be easily removed. Line a dish with aluminium foil, shiny side up. Add two tablespoons of Bicarbonate of Soda. Pour in one litre of water then add cutlery. Watch the tarnish disappear with a strong smell of Sulphur. Rinse and buff dry. Voila!
